Challenges to attaining and maintaining representativeness on CRCs

- → CRC resembling the community demographically (descriptive representation) is difficult to achieve in most communities.
- → "The active population of any society is not representative of the population as a whole." (Wollenback & Selle, 2003; Verba & Nie, 1972)
- → CRCs are themselves small (< 12 members), and often pre-existing.
- → Birds of a feather flock together (homophily).
- → Burnout and turnover








How is the CRC connected to a diverse community?


- → Is the CRC ideally placed within the community...
